## W. E. Whitehead Honor Proxy for Draft Boards

Walter E. Whitehead, member of the local draft board at Carlton, Ga., will represent the draft boards of the state at a White House ceremony in Washington at 3 p. m. Jan. 21, 1946, according to an announcement by Col. J. W. Keelin Jr., state director of selective service. At this ceremony, the President will award a medal to the local board member selected to represent each state.

Frank D. Brooke, of Washington, is the first alternate from Georgia; Cliff P. Vaughn, of Roswell, the second alternate, and Frank A. White, of Augusta, the third alternate. Both the principal and the alternates were selected by lot. Selections were from the names of members who have served the local boards for five years or more.

By act of congress, members of all local board with five years' service are entitled to receive medals and certificates of award. In order to present these medals, there will be a meeting in Atlanta on Jan. 28 of all selective service personnel of the state entitled to receive them. Gov. Arnall will make the presentation address.

The medals to be awarded are cast in bronze and will suspend from a gold and blue ribbon. They bear an appropriate inscription with the name of each recipient. The certificate of award which accompanies the medal contains the following wording:

"In appreciation of your loyal and faithful adherence to duty, given voluntarily and without compensation to the impartial administration of the selective service system, the government of these United States expresses its gratitude in this public recognition of your patriotic services."
